An Act Concerning the Definition of Security Guard.

---



2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 32 MRSA §9403, sub-§9, as amended by PL 1987, c. 701, §4, is  
further amended to read:

6 9. Security guard. "Security guard" means any person who,  
for any consideration whatsoever, performs any of the following  
8 functions:

10 A. Protection of individuals or property from harm or theft  
of property of any kind;

12 B. Prevention, observation or detection of any unauthorized  
14 activity on private property;

16 C. Prevention of unlawful intrusion or entry, larceny,  
vandalism, abuse, arson or trespass on private property;

18 E. Street patrol service; or

20 F. Armored car service.

22 For purposes of this subsection, "security guard" does not mean a  
24 person who sells or services locks.

28 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

30 The purpose of this bill is specifically to remove  
locksmiths from the laws regulating security guards. This bill  
32 amends the definition of security guard to exempt explicitly  
persons who sell and service locks.
