IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY

An Act to Improve Maine Occupational Safety and Health Provisions.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 26 MRSA §565, as amended by PL 1977, c. 694, §461, is further amended to read:

§565. Powers and duties of board

The board shall formulate and adopt reasonable rules and regulations, pursuant to Title 5, section -8051 -et seq. chapter 375, subchapter II, for safe and healthful working conditions, 10 including rules requiring the use of personal protective 12 equipment, monitoring and record keeping. rules The regulations so formulated shall at a minimum conform as-far-as 14 practicable to nationally--recognized federal standards occupational safety and health, so that the state program can be federally approved as a public employee only occupational safety and health program. Such These rules and-regulations shall not become effective sooner than 90 days after the date of their 18 adoption and promulgation.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to require the state Board of Occupational Safety and Health to formulate and adopt rules and reporting procedures which conform to federal occupational safety and health standards. The modest changes required will yield important improvements in health and safety protection for Maine workers and qualify the Maine program to receive 50% federal funding. The bill also makes some nonsubstantive technical changes to the law.

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
