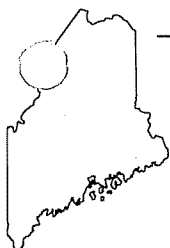

The Maine Head Injury Foundation provides head injury and brain trauma support services to injured persons in the State. Effective September 30, 1990, the Bureau of Rehabilitation will no longer provide funds to the Maine Head Injury Foundation. This bill provides the foundation with temporary funding, while it seeks to broaden its budget base from a variety of other funding sources. This bill provides the foundation with funds to continue education, referral, advocacy and support services for brain trauma and head-injured persons in the State.
