An Act to Require Certain Crew Standards for Railroad Safety.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

 Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
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A. "Conductor" means a person who is responsible for all novements of a train, including the consist of a train and the location of cars on the train, who keeps and implements
