An Act to Return Certain Positions within the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation to Classified Service under the Civil Service Law and to Establish Uniform Pay Schedules.



2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1.** 34-B MRSA §1204, sub-§2, ¶¶D and E, as enacted PL 1989,
c. 501, Pt. P, §29, are repealed.

6 **Sec. 2.** P&SL 1975, c. 147, Pt. D, §3, SCHEDULE 1b, first ¶, as
enacted by PL 1989, c. 501, Pt. P, §33, is amended to read:

18 Schedule 1b provides a maximum adjusted pay grade schedule
and grades are subject to normal increases ~~authorized by law as~~
20 provided by appropriate collective bargaining agreements.
Employees under these pay grades are authorized the option of a
22 5% salary increase in lieu of state payment of the employee's
individual retirement contribution.

28 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

30 This bill removes the requirement that physicians waive
their collective bargaining rights in order to secure pay
adjustments intended to promote recruitment and retention of
32 medical personnel at state institutions.
