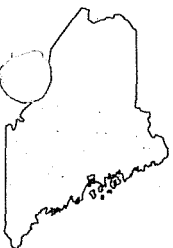

An Act to Increase Penalties for Violation of the Pesticide Laws.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2
4 22 MRSA §1471-J, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c.
770, §§91 and 92, is amended to read:

6 **§1471 J. Penalties**

8 Any person who violates any provision of this chapter or any
10 order, regulation, decision, certificate or license issued by the
board or does any act constituting a ground for revocation except
12 in section 1471-D, subsection 8, paragraphs A and H shall be
punished by a fine of not more than ~~\$500~~ \$5,000 for the first
14 offense, and ~~not less than \$500~~ \$10,000 for each subsequent
offense. Each day that any person so operates shall be considered
16 a separate offense.

18 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

20 This bill increases the penalties for violations of the
pesticide laws.
