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An Act to Expand Eligibility for the Elderly Low-cost Drug Program.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

36 MRSA §6162-A, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL  
4 1987, c. 876, §§4, 10, is repealed and the following enacted in  
its place:

6  
2. Income. Except for income limitations under section  
8 6206, eligibility for this program is determined by the income  
10 provisions of chapter 907. For the purposes of this chapter, a  
12 claimant representing an elderly household qualifies for this  
program subject to the following income limitations.

14 A. For single-member elderly households, the income  
limitation is \$9,600.

16 B. For elderly households with 2 or more members, the  
18 income limitation is \$12,500.

22 STATEMENT OF FACT

24 This bill changes the eligibility ceiling for the elderly  
26 low-cost drug program from \$7,700 to \$9,600 for one person and  
from \$9,600 to \$12,500 for a two-person household.
