COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 765, L.D. 1990, Bill, "An Act Regarding Resource Protection Zones within Shoreland Zoning Areas"

Amend the bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following:

'An Act Regarding Certain Resource Protection Zones within Shoreland Zoning Areas'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the beginning of the first line after the enacting clause (page 1, line 3 in L.D.) the following: **'Sec. 1.'**

Further amend the bill in subsection 5 in paragraph B in the last line (page 1, line 21 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "hazards;" and inserting in its place the following: **'hazards; and'**

Further amend the bill in subsection 5 by striking out all of paragraphs C and D (page 1, lines 23 to 27 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following:

'C. Any site within a shoreland area zoned for resource protection abutting a great pond, beyond the 75-foot strip restricted in paragraph B, where timber is harvested must be reforested within 2 growing seasons after the completion of the harvest, according to guidelines adopted by the board. The board shall adopt guidelines consistent with minimum stocking standards promulgated pursuant to Title 12, section 8869.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 2. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue within the Lake Environmental Protection Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This amendment requires any site within a resource protection zone abutting a great pond that is harvested to be reforested according to guidelines adopted by the Board of Environmental Protection. In developing guidelines, the board must follow minimum stocking standards under the forest practices laws.

The amendment deallocates funds from the Lake Environmental Protection Fund to cover the costs of rulemaking.
