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At the close of each fiscal year, there shall be transferred from the General Fund such amount as may be available from time to time until the maximum of \$1,350,000 shall be achieved, except that in the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990, the amount shall not exceed \$1,425,000.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides \$75,000 from the State Contingent Account to provide immediate job training, unemployment counseling, retraining and other assistance to workers displaced by Great Northern Paper Company. This bill replicates legislation passed in 1986 during a similar period of job terminations in the Millinocket area.
