

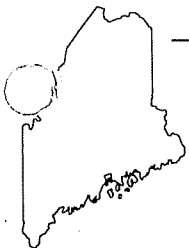

An Act to Enable Rulemaking by the Board of Examiners of Podiatrists.



2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §3605,** as amended by PL 1977, c. 694, §617,
is repealed.

6 **Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §3605-A** is enacted to read:

8 **§3605-A. Rules**

10 In accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act,
12 Title 5, chapter 375, the board may promulgate rules as it
determines necessary and proper to carry out the purposes of this
14 chapter.

16 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

18 Current law limits the scope of the rule-making authority of
20 the Board of Examiners of Podiatrists to false, deceptive and
22 engage in rulemaking as necessary to implement its practice act.
