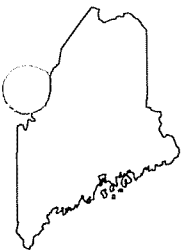

An Act Concerning the Composition of the Advisory Council to the
Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2
4 12 MRSA §7033, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt.
B, §64, is further amended to read:

6 1. **Appointment.** The advisory council, established by Title
8 5, section 12004-G, subsection 20, shall consist of ~~one member~~
10 ~~representing each of the management units the commissioner~~
12 ~~establishes to administer chapters 701 to 721~~ 10 members. The
14 membership of the council must be apportioned such that all
16 members represent comparable numbers of citizens. Members of the
18 advisory council shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to
20 review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having
22 jurisdiction over fisheries and wildlife matters and to
24 confirmation by the Legislature. The commissioner shall be a
nonvoting member of the council ex officio, but may vote to break
a tie.

STATEMENT OF FACT

22 This bill increases the membership of the advisory council
24 to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The bill
also reapportions the membership to achieve more equal statewide
representation.
