(EMERGENCY)



	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6	Whereas, rising medical costs are an increasing burden on the elderly of this State; and
8	Whereas, recent legislation easing the financial burden on participants in the Elderly Low-cost Drug Program will not take
10	effect until July 1, 1990; and
12	Whereas, this legislation seeks to make that legislation immediately effective; and
14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
16	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
18	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
20	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22	Sec. 1. PL 1989, c. 596, Pt. N, 89 is repealed.
24	Sec. 2. Application. The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22,
26	section 254, as amended by Public Law 1989, chapter 564, becomes effective on the effective date of this Act.
28	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the
30	preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
