IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY

An Act to Provide Emergency Assistance and Permanent Housing for the Homeless.

(EMERGENCY)

**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the problem of homelessness is increasing in the State; and

8 Whereas, funding was appropriated during the First Special Session of the 114th Legislature to provide emergency assistance 10 to the homeless during the first year of the biennium; and

12 Whereas, additional funding must be appropriated to ensure that these services are continued during the 2nd year of the biennium; and

16 Whereas, programs to provide transitional and permanent housing are needed immediately to provide more comprehensive 18 assistance to the homeless; and

20 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 24 safety; now, therefore,

- 26 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
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**Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
