(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and Whereas, the 90-day waiting period may impose a hardship on those individuals utilizing day habilitation services; and 6 8 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 10 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately. necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, 12 14 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: PL 1989, c. 501, Pt. A, §1, under the caption, DEPARTMENT OF 16 MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION and under the 4th 18 heading of Mental Retardation Services - Community, is amended to read: 20 Provides funds for day 22 habilitation services for people with mental 24 retardation, including transportation services, for 26 which federal funding has terminated. Nο 28 transportation services, for the number of clients in any 30 group currently funded in part or in whole by the 32 State, may be decreased prier te--April--1,-1990. These 34 funds carry to June 30, 1991. 36 STATEMENT OF FACT 38 The purpose of this bill is to ensure that there will be no reduction in transportation services for individuals utilizing 40
