IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY

An Act to Assist the Department of Human Services in Conducting Chronic Disease Investigations and Evaluating the Completeness or Data Quality of its Disease Surveillance Programs.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

۰.	<u>The Department of Human Services shall be given access to</u>
8	all confidential reports and records filed, by physicians, hospitals or other private or public sector organizations, with
10	all departments, agencies, commissions or boards of the State for the purpose of conducting investigations or evaluating the
12	completeness or quality of data submitted to the department's disease surveillance programs. The department shall follow the
14	data confidentiality requirements of the departments, agencies, commissions or boards of the State providing this information.
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18	<u>Upon notification by the Department of Human Services,</u> physicians or hospitals shall provide to the department any
20	further information requested for the purpose of conducting
20	investigations or evaluating the completeness or quality of data submitted to the department's disease surveillance programs.

30	STATEMENT OF FACT
32	The Department of Human Services is cooperating with the
34	Maine Health Care Finance Commission on a project supported by the Centers for Disease Control to establish a chronic disease surveillance system by linking hospital discharge data with
