An Act to Determine the Prevalence of Lyme Disease in Maine.

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	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA c. 271, sub-c. IV is enacted to read:

8	LYME DISEASE INVESTIGATION  AND INFORMATION
10	§1696-I. Lyme disease
12	The bureau shall track, record and maintain a registry of cases of Lyme disease occurring in humans in this State. The
14	bureau shall collect, maintain, disseminate and act as a central clearinghouse for information relating to Lyme disease. This
16	information must be available to members of the medical community, the Committee on Lyme Disease and the public. The
18	bureau shall prepare and maintain printed educational materials concerning Lyme disease.
20	Sec. 2. Committee on Lyme Disease.
22	1. Committee established; membership. The Committee on
24	Lyme Disease is established. The committee consists of the following 9 members:
26	A. One representative of the Department of Human Services,
30	Bureau of Health, appointed by the Commissioner of Human Services;
	B. One representative of the Department of Inland Fisheries
32	and Wildlife appointed by the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife;
36	C. One representative of the Department of Conservation appointed by the Commissioner of Conservation;
38	D. One representative of the Department of Agriculture,
40	Food and Rural Resources appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources;
42	E. One representative of the Department of Economic and
44	Community Development, Office of Tourism, appointed by the Commissioner of Economic and Community Development;
46	F. One representative of the Maine Medical Center appointed
48	by the Commissioner of Human Services; and  G. Three private medical practitioners appointed by the
50	Commissioner of Human Services

2	The representative of the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Health, shall act as chair.
4	2. Duties. The committee shall develop recommendations for the Commissioner of Human Services on addressing the public
6	health problem of Lyme disease in this State.
8	3. Report. The committee shall submit its report to the Commissioner of Human Services by December 1, 1990.
10	4. Reimbursement. Members of the committee who are not
12	state employees are entitled to receive expenses as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon
14	application to the Commissioner of Human Services.
16	Sec. 3. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
