	STATEMENT OF FACT

	This amendment provides that the legislative positions on
24	the Travel Information Advisory Council are permanent positions
	and not temporary study positions as in the committee amendment.

	This amendment also retains the provision in the committee
28	amendment that replaces the representative of the former Keep
	Maine Scenic Committee with a representative of garden clubs and
30	retains the emergency preamble and clause.
