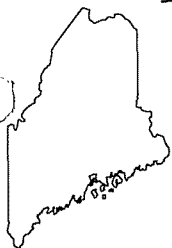

An Act to Appropriate Funds for Alternatives to Juvenile Detention.



2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from
the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

12 All Other \$75,000

14 Provides matching funds for federal grants

22 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

24 This bill provides temporary matching funds to continue
26 vital community-based supervision of alleged and adjudicated
juvenile offenders.

28 The funds provided by this bill will be used by the
30 Department of Corrections to provide the 25% match required
during the 1990-91 program year to continue these supervisory
32 programs while the department prepares the plan required by the
Legislature and develops the budget necessary to support
34 permanent, integrated, community-based supervision for juveniles
statewide.
