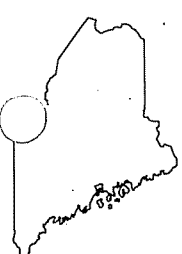

**An Act to Prohibit the Breaking of Glass Products in Games of Skill.**

---



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2  
4 17 MRSA §331, sub-§9 is enacted to read:

6 9. Glass-breaking games. Games of skill which involve the  
8 breaking of glass are prohibited.

10 STATEMENT OF FACT

12 The purpose of this bill is to eliminate the destruction of  
14 glass bottles that are used as targets in games of skill in an  
16 effort to encourage the reuse or recycling of the glass bottles.  
This bill prohibits games of skill which involve the breaking of  
glass. Anyone who violates this provision is guilty of a Class D  
crime under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17, section 346.
