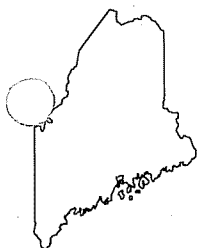

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An Act to Amend the Moose Hunting Laws.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2  
4 12 MRSA §7463-A, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 118, §2,  
is amended to read:

6 6. **Application procedure.** Eligible persons wishing to apply  
8 for a permit shall file a written application for a permit on a  
form furnished by the commissioner. The application shall be  
10 accompanied by an application fee of \$5 for residents and \$10 for  
nonresidents and aliens. The application fee may not be refunded.  
12 No ~~person~~ resident may file more than one application. Any ~~person~~  
resident who submits more than one application shall be  
14 disqualified from the selection of permittees. Any nonresident  
or alien who files more than one application must pay an  
application fee for each application filed.

18 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

20 The purpose of this bill is to allow out-of-state hunters to  
22 submit as many applications as they wish for the moose hunting  
permit drawing and to require a fee for each out-of-state  
application submitted.
