COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1533, L.D. 2118, Bill, "An Act Regarding Municipal Shellfish Regulations"

16 Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the 18 following:

20 'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
 22 as emergencies; and

24 Whereas, the clam size tolerance allowed clam diggers and clam dealers under the current law is being widely violated and 26 creates major enforcement problems for the Department of Marine Resources and local shellfish wardens; and

Whereas, the Department of Marine Resources needs time to 30 adopt rules prior to the effective date of the changes provided for in this Act; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6601. sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7. Identification tags; rules. Any person licensed under
this section shall attach an identification tag that includes a license number to each container of soft-shelled clams before
sale. The commissioner shall adopt rules in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375,
governing the use of identification tags required pursuant to this subsection including, but not limited to, the nature, timing
and placement of identification tags.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1533, L.D. 2118

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6681, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 838, §6, is amended to read:

Tolerance. Any person may possess soft-shelled clams 4. that are less than 2 inches if, beginning on the effective date 6 of this Article article, they comprise less than 30% of any bulk pile; beginning in calendar year 1985, they comprise less than 8 20% of any bulk pile; and beginning in calendar year 1986, they comprise less than 10% of any bulk pile. The tolerance shall-be 10 is determined by numerical count of not less than one peck nor 12 more than 4 pecks taken at random from various parts of the bulk pile or by a count of the entire pile if it contains less than one peck. This subsection is repealed July 1, 1990. 14

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

FISCAL NOTE

 Enactment of this bill requires the Department of Marine Resources to adopt rules governing the clam digger identification
 tag system. All costs associated with the adoption of rules will be absorbed by the Department of Marine Resources utilizing
 budgeted resources.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment deletes the original bill and removes the existing 10% tolerance for clams less than the 2-inch minimum size. Clam diggers will be required to attach identification tags that include their license numbers to containers of clams before they are sold.

The Commissioner of Marine Resources is required to adopt 38 rules implementing the clam digger identification tag requirement. A fiscal note and an emergency preamble and clause 40 are added.
