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The commissioner shall, within 30 days following receipt of application for a license to operate a food establishment or a food salvage establishment or to act as a salvage broker, issue a the appropriate license to-operate-any-food-establishment--which as long as the applicant is found-to-comply in compliance with this chapter and any rules and--regulations adopted by the commissioner. When any such applicant, upon inspection by the commissioner, is found not to meet the requirements of this chapter or regulations rules adopted hereunder under this chapter, the commissioner is authorized to issue either a temporary license for a specified period not to exceed 90 days, during which time corrections specified by the commissioner shall be made by the applicant for compliance, or a conditional license setting forth conditions which shall be met by the applicant to the satisfaction of the commissioner.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides for the regulation of food salvage operations by requiring food salvage establishments and food salvage brokers to be licensed in the same manner as other food establishments under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, chapter 551.
