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- 3. Sample collection. Each month the board shall select,
 on a rotating basis, the mahogany quahog harvesters responsible
 for the collection of mahogany quahog samples. A condition of
 licensing is that each licensee participating in the sample
 collection process must collect samples and provide transport to
 and from sampling locations.
 - 4. Department responsibilities. The Department of Marine Resources is responsible for the identification of all sampling areas, stations and the scheduling of all sampling runs. A department observer shall be on board all vessels engaged in the sampling activity. The commissioner or the commissioner's designee shall notify the licensee in advance as to the time, location and number of samples to be collected. In the event the weekly collection of samples is not feasible, an alternative sampling date may be established by the department.
 - 5. Noncompliance. If the department determines that a harvester selected by the board is not meeting all required conditions under a mahogany quahog license, the department will notify the chair of the board. The board shall either resolve the issue with the harvester or make a recommendation to the commissioner that the harvester's license be revoked.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

Mahogany quahogs are similar to mussels and clams and are susceptible to paralytic shellfish toxin, or "red tide." In order to safeguard public health, the Department of Marine Resources must provide adequate monitoring to ensure the consumer a safe and wholesome product. This bill establishes a monitoring program by creating a mahogany quahog license and monitoring board responsible for enhanced industry participation with the Department of Marine Resources to guarantee quality shellfish.
