HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 830,
L.D. 2138, Bill, "An Act to Amend and Improve the Education Laws
of Maine"

Amend the amendment in section 14 in Table 1 by striking out
the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 9 and 10 in amendment) and
inserting in their place the following:

'1993	\$67,000,000
1994	\$67,000,000'

Further amend the amendment by inserting after section 14
the following:

'Sec. 15. 20-A MRSA §15905, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1981, c.
693, §§5 and 8, is amended to read:

4. Rules. The state board may adopt or amend rules
relating to the approval of school construction projects.

The state board is encouraged to review school construction rules
regarding costs per square foot, consider other measures for
containing building costs and report on these efforts to the
joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction
over education matters during the First Regular Session of the
115th Legislature.'

Further amend the amendment in the fiscal note by striking
out all of the last 2 lines (page 2, lines 42 and 43 in
amendment) and inserting in their place the following:

'1992-93	\$2,272,000
1993-94	\$2,272,000'

6 This amendment changes the maximum debt service limit for
8 fiscal years 1993 and 1994 to \$67,000,000. The amendment also
adds language to encourage the State Board of Education to study
certain school construction rules and report to the Joint
Standing Committee on Education.
