Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not 20 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 22 as emergencies; and 24 Whereas, the Commission to Implement Computerization of Criminal History Record Information is in the midst of developing 26 implementing a computerized criminal history record information system of which warrant information should be a part; 28 30 Whereas, the commission needs to include consideration of warrants in its work as soon as possible; and 3.2 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 34 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 36 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,' 38 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following: 40 'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 42 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.' 44 STATEMENT OF FACT 46 48 This amendment adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to allow the Commission to Implement Computerization of 50 Criminal History Record Information to immediately include the issue of warrants in the development and implementation of the
