COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A " to S.P. 832, L.D. 2140, Bill, "An Act Concerning the Commission to Implement the Computerization of Criminal History Record Information"

Amend the bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following:

**'Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

**Whereas,** the Commission to Implement Computerization of Criminal History Record Information is in the midst of developing and implementing a computerized criminal history record information system of which warrant information should be a part; and

**Whereas,** the commission needs to include consideration of warrants in its work as soon as possible; and

**Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, '

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

**'Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause to allow the Commission to Implement Computerization of Criminal History Record Information to immediately include the issue of warrants in the development and implementation of the computerized criminal history record system.
