An Act to Amend the Laws for the Licensing of Counseling Professionals.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

32 MRSA §13862, 2nd ¶, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 465, §3, is amended to read:

Nothing in this section may prohibit disclosure by a person licensed under this chapter of information concerning a client when that disclosure is required by law and nothing in this section may modify or affect Title 22, sections 3477 to 3479-A and 4011 to 4015.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

Under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, sections 3477 to 3479-A, counseling professionals are required to report to the Department of Human Services cases of abuse, neglect or exploitation of an incapacitated adult. The laws governing the licensing and regulating of counseling professionals neglects to mention this reporting requirement. This bill clarifies the fact that counseling professionals are required to report cases of abuse, neglect or exploitation of incapacitated adults, makes counselors aware of this requirement and requires compliance for licensure.

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
