18	STATEMENT OF FACT

22	This amendment allocates \$1,700,000 in fiscal year 1989-90 in new Stripper Well Fund dollars as follows:
24	 One million, three hundred thousand dollars to provide additional funds for emergency fuel assistance; and
26	
28	Four hundred thousand dollars to repair or replace low-income household heating systems.
30	This amendment also provides that any unexpended balance from this fiscal year be carried forward to increase Low-Income
32	Home Energy Assistance Program benefit levels in fiscal year 1990-91.
