An Act to Amend the Charter of the Bangor Water District.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of M	laine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1957, c. 39, §3 is amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read:

A district decision to enter into, renegotiate, amend or renew a contract to provide or sell water outside the district as described in section 1 is subject to approval by the Bangor City Council.

Sec. 2. P&SL 1957, c. 39, §15 is enacted to read:

Sec. 15. Referenda on district decisions. Upon petition of at least 5% of the voters within the City of Bangor voting in the last gubernatorial election, decision of the district must be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Bangor at a regular election or a special election called and held for that purpose. A special election must be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections, except that the board of registration is not required to prepare for posting, nor the city clerk to post, a new list of voters. For the purpose of registration of voters, the board of voter registration shall be in session the secular day next preceding the special election. The city clerk shall prepare the required ballots, on which the clerk shall reduce the subject matter of the decision to a single question.

The voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the decision.

The decision takes effect immediately upon acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election, provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act equals or exceeds 20% of the total vote for all candidates for Governor cast in the district at the last qubernatorial election.

The result of the vote must be declared by the municipal officers of the City of Bangor and due certificate thereof must be filed by the city clerk with the Secretary of State.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the charter of the Bangor Water District to require Bangor City Council approval of any district decisions to enter into, renegotiate, amend or renew contracts to provide or sell water outside the district. This bill adds a referendum clause to the charter, whereby if 5% of the district's voters sign a petition, the decision may be put to referendum.
