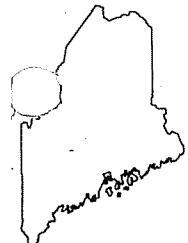

**An Act to Facilitate Policies and Procedures of the Driver Education
Evaluation Program.**



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 MRSA §7202, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 536, §§2 and 11
4 and as amended by c. 773, §§11 and 12, is further amended to read:

§7202. Division of Driver Education Evaluation

8

The Division of Driver Education Evaluation shall administer
the alcohol and other drug education, evaluation and treatment
10 program. The division shall, within 10 days of completion by an
individual of the following requirements, certify to the
12 Secretary of State:

1. Administration of Driver Education Evaluation Program.

Those individuals who have satisfactorily completed the program
16 prescribed by section 7203; and

18

2. Administration of non-Driver Education Evaluation

Program. Those individuals who have satisfactorily completed the
20 requirements of this chapter by satisfying the requirement for
completion of treatment as defined in section 7201 by means other
22 than the program prescribed by section 7203.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill requires the Department of Human Services to
30 submit to the Secretary of State certification within 10 days of
completion of a Driver Education Evaluation Program or completion
32 of treatment required of a person convicted of an alcohol or
drug-related motor vehicle accident. The Office of the Secretary
34 of State is currently experiencing delays in receiving these
reports.
