An Act to Amend the Laws Governing the Military and Naval Children's Home.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill changes the name of the Military and Naval Children's Home to the Bath Children's Home, clarifies the appointment and duties of the director, provides new membership to the Board of Visitors and repeals the reporting provision which presently requires annual review by the Joint Standing Committee on Audit and Program Review.

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
