An Act to Amend Certain Provisions of the Fish and Wildlife Laws.

(EMERGENCY)



	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6	Whereas, confusion exists as to the application of certain laws administered by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife; and

10	Whereas, this confusion poses difficulties for the sporting public and those charged with enforcement of these laws; and
12	Whereas, it is vitally necessary that this confusion be resolved to prevent any injustice or hardship to the hunters,

In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 6 8 STATEMENT OF FACT 10 This bill does the following. 12 It updates language pertaining to the preparation of 14 warden service operating procedures. 16 It makes it clear that wild birds, as well as wild animals, may be taken by bow and arrow during the open season. 18 It restores a provision repealed in 1987 that allows 20 archery hunters to carry a handgun while hunting with bow and arrow during the special archery season on deer. It also makes it clear that any person who carries a handgun while hunting with 22 bow and arrow during the special season must possess both an archery license and a regular hunting license. 24 26 4. It amends existing law to establish a uniform annual fee for the issuance of a Maine guide's license. Under existing law, the guide's license fee is different for residents, nonresidents 28 aliens. A nonresident guide has brought 30 challenging the constitutionality of the requirement that nonresident applicants pay a higher fee. This suit, Kastner v. Vail, Civil Docket No. CV-89-376, is currently pending in the Kennebec County Superior Court. This bill, which establishes a 34 flat license fee, will render that suit moot and therby limit the State's exposure to any award of attorney's fees that might be made pursuant to the federal Civil Rights Attorney's Fees Awards 36 Act of 1976, 42 United States Code, Section 1988. 38 A hide dealer's license allows a person to commercially 40 buy and sell wild animal hides. This bill makes it clear that an accurate record must be kept by the licensee of all such transactions. 42 44 It makes it clear that a person who lawfully takes a deer, moose, bear or furbearing animal may sell the hide, head or gall bladder of that animal without a hide dealer's license. 46 48 It makes it clear that employees of a licensed hide dealer may, without a license, aid or assist in buying raw hides, but only at the licensee's fixed business establishment. 50.

- 8. It establishes prohibited acts for recently enacted laws pertaining to the licensing and conduct of guides.
- 9. It changes from January 15th to March 1st the deadline by which the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife must announce a decision to shorten the bear hunting season. This will allow for adequate time to review bear harvest data from the previous fall, determine whether a shorter hunting season is necessary to protect the black bear resource and comply with the rule-making requirements of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375.

- 11. It creates a prohibited act for illegally presenting a bear for registration.
- 20 12. It removes redundant language pertaining to regulations on reclaimed ponds.
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- 13. It makes it clear that the body of water that constitutes the Dry Pond Sanctuary in Gray appears on maps and is known locally as both Dry Pond and Crystal Lake.
- 14. It increases from \$100 to \$500 the amount of property
 28 damage that must occur before a boating accident must be reported
 to a law enforcement officer. This change is consistent with
 30 recent changes in Coast Guard regulations.
- 32 15. It makes it clear that the fee for snowmobile dealer plates is an annual fee.
- 16. It increases from \$100 to \$500 the amount of property
 36 damage that must occur before a snowmobile accident must be reported to a law enforcement officer.
- 17. It makes it clear that the fee for ATV dealer plates is 40 an annual fee.
- 42 18. It increases from \$200 to \$500 the amount of property damage that must occur before an ATV accident must be reported to 44 a law enforcement officer.
- 19. It makes changes in the dog training laws to make it clear that a hunting license is required in order to train dogs on wild birds and wild animals and that such training may take place on Sundays. Another change would make it lawful to train dogs on bear during the month of August in northern Washington County and northern Hancock County.

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
