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L.D. 2262 2 (Filing No. S-586) 6 STATE OF MAINE **SENATE** 8 114TH LEGISLATURE SECOND REGULAR SESSION 10 12 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 886, L.D. 2262, Bill, "An Act Relating to Pharmacy Services to Nursing Home Residents" 14 Amend the bill by inserting at the beginning of the first 16 line after the enacting clause (page 1, line 3 in L.D.) the following: 'Sec. 1.' 18 Further amend the bill in that part designated "\$1829." by 20 striking out all of subsection 2. 22 Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of 24 fact the following: 'Sec. 2. Committee established; membership. The Committee to 26 Study the Use of Pharmaceuticals in Nursing Homes is established. 28 Membership consists of one representative appointed by the Maine Committee on Aging; one representative from the Bureau of Medical 30 Services appointed by the director of the bureau; representative appointed jointly by the President of the Senate 32 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives from a list of 3 nominees provided by each of the following organizations: the Maine Health Care Association, the Maine Association of Private 34 Residential Facilities for Persons with Developmental Disabilities, the Maine Pharmacists Association, the Maine Nurses 36 Association, the Maine Medical Association, the Long-Term Care 38 the American Society of Consulting Nursing Council and Pharmacists; the executive director of the state employees health insurance program; and 2 consumers of health care services and 40 one Legislator appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The President 42 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives

shall jointly appoint the chair of the committee. All appointments must be made within 30 days of the effective date of this Act. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their appointments. When appointment of all members of the committee

is completed, the chair shall call the first meeting.

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Sec. 4. Staff. The Maine Health Policy Advisory Council shall serve as staff for the committee.

Sec. 5. Report. The committee shall provide a final report, together with any recommended legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources and to the Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council by January 15, 1991.

Sec. 6. Expenses. Members of the committee are not entitled to per diem or expenses for meeting attendance.

## FISCAL NOTE

The Maine Health Policy Advisory Council will provide staff support for the Committee to Study the Use of Pharmaceuticals in Nursing Homes and issue the final report within its budgeted resources.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment removes the provision in the original bill that required that the monthly drug regime review required for residents of nursing homes be performed by a pharmacy other than the one that supplies the medication.

The amendment establishes the Committee to Study the Use of Pharmaceuticals in Nursing Homes to review the issues relating to the provision of pharmaceuticals in nursing homes.
