Resolve, to Create a Pilot Project for a Substance Abuse Halfway House for Pregnant Women and Mothers with Young Children.

Sec. 1. Pilot substance abuse halfway house. Resolved: That the 2 Department of Human Services, Office of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Prevention develop a pilot substance abuse halfway house for pregnant women and mothers with young children. The goal of the 4 halfway house is to facilitate the transition of mothers and б pregnant women from dependence on drugs and alcohol to healthy self-sufficient states in which they can support and care for themselves and their children; and be it further 8

Sec. 2. Project elements. Resolved: That the services offered by the pilot halfway house include stabilization of the chemical dependency of mothers and pregnant women, therapeutic day care for the children of the women participating in the program and coordination of the vocational and educational development of the The project must be conducted by an organization selected women. by the Office of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Prevention through a request-for-proposal system. Criteria for selection must include maximum use of other existing programs in the service region; and be it further

Sec. 3. Evaluation and report. Resolved: That the pilot project be conducted for 3 years from the effective date of this 22 The Office of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Prevention resolve. shall ensure that an evaluation is conducted that assesses the 24 achievement of the project goal specified in this resolve. The office shall present the outcome of the evaluation and its 26 recommendations in a report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over alcoholism and drug abuse matters by December 15, 1993; and be it further

Sec. 4. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
