An Act to Improve the Organizational Structure of the Fish and Wildlife Advisory Council.

(NEW DRAFT OF H.P. 1551, L.D. 2149)

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
Whereas, decisions affecting fish and wildlife resources are
of vital importance to the citizens of this State; and
Whereas, changes in the organizational structure of the
advisory council to the Department of Inland Fisheries and
Wildlife are essential to provide Maine citizens with better and more equitable representation on issues related to fish and
wildlife; and
Whereas, it is important that these changes be implemented
prior to the adoption of regulations that significantly affect
various resource user groups; and
Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

§7033-A. Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Advisory Council
1. Appointment. The Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Advisory
Council, established by Title 5, section 12004-G, subsection 20, to be known as the advisory council, shall consist of 10 members
representing the 16 counties of the State in the following
- manner: one member chall represent Androccoddin Collney Kennebec

County and Sagadahoc County; one member shall represent Aroostook Ź County; one member shall represent Cumberland County; one member shall represent Franklin County and Oxford County; one member shall represent Hancock County; one member shall represent Knox 4 County, Lincoln County and Waldo County; one member shall represent Fenobscot County; one member shall represent 6 Fiscataquis County and Somerset County; one member shall represent Washington County; and one member shall represent York 8 County. Members of the advisory council shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee 10 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over fisheries and wildlife matters and to confirmation by the Legislature. The 1.2 commissioner shall be a nonvoting ex officio member of the 1.4 advisory council, but may vote to break a tie.

An employee of the department may not serve as a member of the advisory council prior to the expiration of one year from that employee's last day of employment with the department. A Legislator who is a member of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over fisheries and wildlife matters may not serve as a member of the advisory council prior to the expiration of one year from that Legislator's last day of membership on that committee.

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2. Length of terms. Appointments must be for a term of 3 years and until successors are appointed and qualified. A person may not serve more than 2 consecutive 3-year terms. On the death, resignation or removal from office of any person appointed to the advisory council, the Governor shall appoint a member to serve for the unexpired term.

3. Expenses. The members of the advisory council are entitled to compensation as provided in Title 5, chapter 379.

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4. Duties. The advisory council shall perform the following duties.

38 40 A. The advisory council shall render to the commissioner information and advice concerning the administration of the department and carry out other duties specifically delegated by chapters 701 to 721.

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B. The advisory council shall hold regular meetings with the commissioner or the commissioner's deputy in December and May of each year and may hold special meetings at such other times and places as are advisable.

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C. All regular and special meetings of the advisory council must be public meetings and must be held in a public meeting place convenient for the public.

D. Public comment must be accepted at regular and special meetings of the advisory council. Comments may be 2 restricted to subjects before the advisory council at the meeting and consistent with any applicable requirements and limitations of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 6 5, chapter 375. Public notice of all regular and special advisory 8 council meetings must be published in a daily newspaper of general circulation, in the geographic area where the 1.0 meeting is scheduled, at least 7 days and not more than 21 days prior to the meeting. That notice must include an 12 agenda or statement of purpose of the meeting. That notice may be combined with any other notice of the meeting 14 required by law. 1.6 5. Officers. At the meeting held in May of each year, the advisory council may elect one member as chair and one member as 18 vice-chair. 20 Sec. 4. Transition provision. Persons who are serving a term on the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Advisory Council at the time 22 this Act becomes effective shall continue to serve until the 24 expiration of their terms. After the effective date of this Act, appointments may be made for any county not then represented on the advisory council, except that the total number of council 26 members may not exceed 10. 28 Sec. 5. 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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

FISCAL NOTE

Enactment of this legislation requires a General Fund appropriation to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife in the amount of \$400 for fiscal year 1989-90 and \$1,600 for fiscal year 1990-91 to provide funds for anticipated per diem and related expenses for 2 additional advisory council members.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Advisory Council currently consists of 8 members representing the wildlife management units of the State. Wildlife management units were established primarily on the basis of land use and climatic conditions and, as a result, each advisory council member represents varying numbers of residents. At the present time, one advisory council member represents nearly 50% of the entire population. In addition, certain council members are an extremely long distance away from some of the people they represent.

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This new draft increases the number of advisory council members from 8 to 10 and establishes representation largely on the basis of population centers, rather than on wildlife management units, through the use of county lines. It also prohibits former employees of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and former legislative members of the Joint Standing Committee on Fisheries and Wildlife from serving as members of the advisory council until one year after their department employment or membership respectively.
