COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 909, L.D. 2312, Bill, "An Act to Establish the Office of Substance Abuse"

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16 Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the effective and coordinated delivery of substance abuse prevention services is essential for Maine citizens; and

26 Whereas, the Office of Substance Abuse created by this Act is the most effective mechanism for delivering those services; and

Whereas, emergency action is necessary so that this Act can 30 take effect on July 1, 1990; and

32 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 34 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 36 safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend the bill in Part A in section A-3 in that part designated "<u>\$20005.</u>" by striking out all of subsection 6 (page 5,
lines 17 to 19 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

- 42 '<u>6. Contracts and licensing. Through the director:</u>
- A. Administer all contracts with community service providers for the delivery of alcohol and drug abuse
 services; and

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2 B. Establish operating and treatment standards, and inspect and issue certificates of approval for drug abuse treatment facilities or programs, including residential treatment 4 centers, pursuant to section 20024. 6 The director may delegate contract and licensing duties under this subsection to the Department of Human Services, the 8 Department of Corrections or the Department of Mental Health and 10 Mental Retardation, as long as that delegation ensures that contracting for substance abuse services provided in community settings are consolidated within the Department of Human 12 Services, that contracting for substance abuse services delivered 14 within correctional facilities are consolidated within the Department of Corrections and that contracting for substance abuse services delivered within mental health and mental 16 retardation facilities are consolidated within the Department of 18 Mental Health and Mental Retardation: ' 20 Further amend the bill in Part A in section A-3 in that part designated "\$20005." by striking out all of subsection 12 (page 22 5, lines 45 to 49 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following: 24 '12. 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office. STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment changes the original bill to allow the B Director of the Office of Substance Abuse to delegate contracting and licensing duties to the Department of Human Services, the Department of Corrections or the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, provided that the director ensures that such delegation results in the consolidation of duties within the appropriate department.

amendment also clarifies that the Department The of 16 Educational and Cultural Services must coordinate all its substance abuse education programs with the Office of Substance Federally funded substance abuse education programs 18 Abuse. administered by the Department of Educational and Cultural Services must be coordinated with the Office of Substance Abuse 20 to the fullest extent possible within the constraints of federal 22 substance abuse education funding. The Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services is required to prepare a plan that provides for the maximum amount of consolidation between the 24 Department of Educational and Cultural Services and the Office of 26 Substance Abuse.

- 28 The amendment also repeals provisions of the law regarding involuntary commitment.
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The amendment retains the provision of the original bill 32 that undedicates the alcohol premium funds. However, the amendment requires that the Office of Substance Abuse receive 34 appropriation amounts at least equal to the amount collected each year by the State Liquor Commission through the premium fund.

The amendment also makes the bill an emergency and sets its 38 effective date at July 1, 1990. A fiscal note has also been added to the bill.
