Warning System .

2 **Sec. 1. Department of Human Services directed to develop poison**
warning program. **Resolved:** That the Department of Human Services
is directed to develop a poison warning symbol and program
4 designed to educate and alert children to the dangers associated
with ingesting, inhaling or touching certain household products;
6 and be it further

8 **Sec. 2. Department of Human Services to study alternative methods**
of financing. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services is
10 directed to study methods of financing the poison warning program
that will involve the participation of the private sector,
12 including, but not limited to, the financial sponsorship of the
program by one or more private business concerns; and be it

16 **Sec. 3. Report. Resolved:** That the Department of Human
Services is directed to submit a report on its proposed poison
18 warning program, including recommendations for implementation and
funding, to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources no
20 later than January 31, 1991.

24 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

26 This resolve directs the Department of Human Services to
develop a poison warning program to alert children to the dangers
