Resolve, to Create the Commission on Effective Information Systems in State Government.



Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission Effective Information Systems State on in Government is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership; chair. Resolved: That the commission consist of the following 13 members:

1. Three members to be appointed by the President of the Senate, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator, and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State;

2. Three members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator, and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State;

Six members to be appointed by the Governor, not more 3. than one of whom may be a Legislator, and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State; and

One member, to be appointed by the other 12 commission 4. 22 members, who shall serve as the chair; and be it further

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Sec. 3. Appointment; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by the Governor, the President of the 28 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives when their character bill is selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of the commission, at which time the commission may appoint the 13th and final commission member; and be it further

> Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall undertake a study of the existing information management systems in State Government, with a primary goal of proposing an effective information management system within State Government. As part of the study the commission shall:

Identify the data and information currently being 1. compiled within State Government; who uses it and how; and the data and information unavailable for critical purposes such as projecting trends and monitoring change;

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Investigate the impact of an information management 2. 46 system on current management style;

48 3. Recommend ways to manage and update data and information in a readily accessible, integrated and meaningful format, and to 50 ensure that quantifiable measures are available for monitoring State's environment, economy, people and change in the governmental activity; 52

4. Evaluate alternative information management systems;

8 5. Recommend ways to improve and connect existing electronic networks and review and recommend ways to improve the
6 procedures for purchasing computer systems;

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8 6. Assess the need for a cabinet-level Chief Information Officer; and

 Review methods to conduct long-term cost-benefit
analyses of state initiatives and computerized access links at regional and local governmental offices and libraries, and office
environments of the future.

16 In the performance of its duties, the commission may hold public hearings and conferences with any person, persons, organizations or governmental agencies. The commission is to be 18 provided information, reports or other assistance from any 20 department, legislative agency, committee or other instrumentality of the State, with the consent of the head of the respective organization. 26 Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report together with any enabling legislation to the 28 Legislature by December 1, 1991; and be it further

30 Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the State Planning Office shall staff the commission to conduct research and prepare 32 reports for the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: 34 That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the 36 legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission All members of the commission who are not state 38 meetings. employees receive expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised 40 Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further 42
