- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Evaluate the Need for Changes in the Responsibilities of State, County and Local Government for the 21st Century is established; and be it further

 Sec. 2. Commission membership; chair. Resolved: That the commission consist of the following 13 members:
- 1. Three members to be appointed by the President of the Senate, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator, and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State;

- 2. Three members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator, and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State;
- 3. Six members to be appointed by the Governor, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator, and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State; and
 - 4. One member to be appointed by the other 12 commission members, who shall serve as the chair; and be it further
 - Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives when their selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of the commission, at which time the commission may appoint the 13th and final commission member; and be it further
 - Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall undertake a study of the State's rules of local, regional and county government and State Government, with a primary goal of proposing changes that will more closely fit the needs of the 21st century. As part of the study, the commission shall:
 - Review recent studies and analyses of the status of State Government and local government;
 - Evaluate the current functions and responsibilities of State Government and county and local government in this State;
- 3. Identify which of the current functions of each level of government are outmoded or ineffectively carried out and which should be expanded or reassigned to other levels;

- 4. Recommend mechanisms for facilitating town decision making, and ways to assure stable funding and accountability;
