## **STATEMENT OF FACT**

Section H-1 clarifies that the new mobile home warranty laws 48 apply to dealers who customarily sell mobile homes to consumers and section H-2 is an effective date for that provision.

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Section H-3 adds language to the Maine Revised Statutes, 52 Title 15, section 101-C, subsection 3, that was inadvertently

Section H-4 deletes a reference to the Keep Maine Scenic 4 Committee that no longer exists and makes a technical correction concerning gender. 6 Sections H-5 and H-6 make technical changes and extend 8 continuing education requirements to insurance agents dealing in 10 health insurance. Section H-7 adds language that was inadvertently omitted 12 from the committee amendment. 14 Section H-8 reformats Title 38, section 1310-X and clarifies 16 dates. Section H-9 corrects an incomplete history. 18 20 Section H-10 clarifies the charter of the Northern Regional Planning Commission and the Northern Maine Regional Planning Commission regarding the terms served by the chair, vice-chair, 22 secretary and treasurer of the executive board. 24 The sections in Part I replace references to the Executive 26 Director of the Technical College System with the President of the Technical College System.
