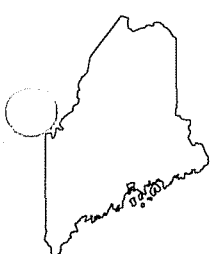

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from
the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

26 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

28 This bill provides a 5% cost of living adjustment to the
salary and wages of the staff at St. Andre Home, Inc. The agency
30 provides 3 sheltered group home programs for unmarried mothers,
pregnant adolescents, and troubled or homeless young women in
32 Bangor, Biddeford and Lewiston. The agency also provides, on a
statewide basis, nonresidential counseling programs to unmarried
34 mothers and pregnant young women, and comprehensive adoption
services.
