24	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
26	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
28	Whereas, the timely completion of the study authorized in
30	this Act requires that the study begin before 90 days have passed; and
32	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
34	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
36	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
38	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
40	Sec. 1. Study authorized; purpose. The Joint Standing Committee
42	on Marine Resources shall conduct a study of the aquaculture
44	industry in the State. Aquaculture is a rapidly growing industry with potentially significant effects on the State's environment and economy. The purpose of the study is to review the adequacy
46	of the laws that govern the monitoring and control of the effects
48	of aquaculture on the environment and review state policies on the development of aquaculture.

14	STATEMENT OF FACT
16	
	This amendment deletes the bill and requests a study by the
18	Joint Standing Committee on Marine Resources on the State's aquaculture industry. The committee regards this study as
20	essential to adequately educate committee members about this controversial and significant marine industry and to prepare the
22	committee to make sound recommendations to the Legislature regarding aquaculture.
