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## STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment adds to the duties of the proposed Office of Children and its director the responsibilities of preparing and submitting a proposal to implement the most cost-effective method of delivering services to families and children. The most cost-effective method of service delivery is to be determined by the office, in cooperation with the Advisory Committee on Children and other child and family advocacy groups. The proposal must be prepared and presented to the Governor and the Legislature by January 1, 1991.
