SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to S.P. 937, L.D. 2372

2	STATEMENT OF FACT
4	This amendment changes the law that exempts clubs, groups and organizations made up exclusively of individuals at least 62
6	years of age from the beano application and licensing provisions. Under this amendment, an elderly group would be
8	eligible for the exemption if at least 90% of the individuals making up that group are 62 years of age or older.
