An Act to Amend the State Railroad Preservation and Assistance Act.

(EMERGENCY)



	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6	Whereas, certain provisions in the State Railroad Preservation and Assistance Act unduly restrict the ability of the Department of Transportation to manage rail lines the
8	department has acquired or leased, hindering the development of freight and passenger rail service in the State; and

12	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
14	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
16	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
