	Sec. 1. Cumberland County Department of Corrections established.
4	Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in the Maine
	Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, chapter 13, the Cumberland County
6	Department of Corrections is established to maintain and operate

	Sec. 2. Cumberland County Director of Corrections. The county

The Cumberland County Director of Corrections, to serve ex officio; and Two other members, appointed by the county commissioners. 10 Members of the advisory committee serve 3-year staggered 12 terms. 14 The advisory committee shall prepare a budget proposal for the Cumberland County Department of Corrections by September 16 1st of each year. Sec. 4. Transportation of committed offenders and detainees. The 18 Cumberland County sheriff retains responsibility court-ordered transportation of committed offenders and detainees. 20 Sec. 5. Application. Notwithstanding the establishment of the 2.2 Cumberland County Department of Corrections in section 1 of this Act, the department may not undertake the administration of 24 correctional facilities until January 1, 1991. 26 Sec. 6. Transition. To provide for the smooth transition and 28 continued operation of jails and detention centers during the transfer of the operation of those facilities from the Cumberland sheriff the Cumberland County Department 30 to Corrections, a transition period is established that begins on the effective date of this Act and ends on January 1, 1991. 32 34 Beginning January 1, 1991, the Cumberland County Department of Corrections shall assume the cost of administering and operating Cumberland County jails and detention centers, 36 including personnel, contractual, commodities and capital costs. 38 The Cumberland County sheriff, or a designee, shall, by January 1, 1991, surrender and transfer to the Cumberland County 40 Director of Corrections all jail records and capital equipment necessary to administer and operate the county's jails and 42 detention centers pursuant to this section and other applicable 44 state and federal laws. All active and inactive records and files, whether 46 stored in manual files or electronic media, are transferred under this section. At a minimum, this transfer includes,

40	Sec. 7. Revision clause. Wherever in the Maine Revised Statutes the word "sheriff" is used in connection with the
42	administration or operation of a county jail, for the purposes of
44	Cumberland County, "sheriff" means the Cumberland County Director of Corrections.
