An Act Concerning the Collection of Inspection Fees for Overboard Discharge.

(AFTER DEADLINE)



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

38 MRSA §414, sub-§3-A, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 442, §2, is amended to read:

3-A. Inspection of overboard discharges. The department shall inspect all licensed overboard discharges a minimum of twice each calendar year. The department shall assess all costs of inspection, including personnel costs and necessary laboratory analyses, to the license holder. No assessment under this section may exceed \$100 \$50 annually. An assessment may not be made until after an inspection is performed. The department shall adopt rules in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act to establish quidelines under which payment of an assessment for inspection may be waived. All revenues received under this subsection shall must be credited to the Maine Environmental Protection Fund. The department may retain private contractors to undertake the inspections required under this subsection.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill amends the law concerning inspection of overboard discharges by limiting the annual fee assessment for 2 inspections to \$50. The bill also prohibits an assessment from being made until the inspection is performed. The bill requires the Department of Environmental Protection to establish quidelines to allow for the waiver of assessments.
