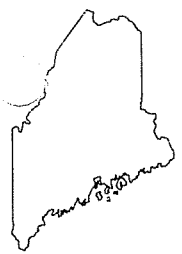

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

28-A MRSA §2075, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:

6 2-A. Evidence. The possession of more than 4 quarts of
8 spirits in one or more containers that are not labeled in
accordance with Title 32, section 1865, is prima facie evidence
of a violation of this section.

STATEMENT OF FACT

14 This bill makes possession of more than 4 quarts of spirits
16 not labeled with redemption stickers under the State's bottle
18 bill prima facie evidence of illegal importation and
transportation of spirits. Illegal importation and
transportation of spirits is a Class E crime.
