2-A. Transportation fee. The department shall collect a transportation fee in the amount of 2¢ per gallon of water for water that is an exception under subsection 2, paragraph D, and is transported for commercial purposes beyond the boundaries of the municipality or township in which the water is naturally located or any bordering municipality or township. Fees collected under this subsection are paid to the Maine Environmental Protection Fund to provide for water cleanup.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill authorizes the Department of Human Services to collect a fee, to be paid to the Maine Environmental Protection Fund, of $2\rlap/e$ per gallon of water that is transported beyond the water source and is used to supply water for bottling and sale.
