HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 957,
L.D. 2421, Bill, "An Act Regarding the Administration of the
Maine Children's Trust Fund"

Amend the amendment by striking out everything after the
first paragraph after the title and inserting in its place the
following:

'22 MRSA §3724, sub-§11 is enacted to read:

11. Study of options for administrative assistance. To facilitate the management, administration and distribution of fund money, the board shall conduct a study of the potential positive and negative consequences of entering into a contract with a statewide public foundation created to attract and manage charitable funds and to distribute the income to Maine nonprofit organizations to help solve community problems and enhance the quality of life in the State. The board shall report its findings to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resource matters and the Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council no later than January 15, 1991, and any recommended legislation based on these findings.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this amendment is to increase the proportion of the Maine Children's Trust Fund money that is granted to community prevention programs, either through increased income or through reduced administrative costs, or both. The Board of the Maine Children's Trust Fund is required to conduct a study in cooperation with a statewide public foundation created to attract

2 and manage charitable funds, such as the Maine Community
Foundation, Inc., to determine whether some form of subordinate
4 or contractual or other relationship would achieve these goals
and to report its recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee
6 on Human Resources and the Office of the Executive Director of
the Legislative Council no later than January 15, 1991.
